Corn season is here!! This is easy, it works, and the corn tastes great. When you follow the directions below, you will end up with corn that has no (yes, I said 'no') silk clinging to it.

### **How to Microwave Corn on the Cob in the Husk**

Leave the husks on the corn.

Cook:

1 ear	2 minutes
2 ears	4 minutes
3 ears	5 minutes
4 ears	6 minutes



Allow the corn to cool after cooking for about 5 minutes.

Cut about 1 inch off of the end of the corn that has a stub.

Grab the end of the corn with the silk and pull it away.

### Guidelines for the 2018 Challenge:

1. All quilts will measure 6 inches by 36 inches and will have a Quilt top, Batting, Backing, and Label.
2. Quilts may be oriented Vertically or Horizontally.
3. Guild Members may submit 2 entries in this Challenge!
4. That's it for rules! Anything Goes: Binding, Self-Binding, No Binding, Your choice of fabric, design, and techniques.
5. Important Dates: **15 JUN**– Sign-up at Guild or email Jill or Deb.  
**15 OCT**– For All Entries: send Quilter's Name and Quilt Name to Jill or Deb.  
**5 NOV**- Quilts must be turned in at the Guild by 6pm.

Labels must be covered to ensure blind judging. Voting will take place at both the November Evening and Day meetings. Awards will be presented at the Day meeting on **Nov 7th**. Each quilt is eligible to win only one Award, except the Viewer's Choice.
