UPCOMING PROGRAMS 2018

<u>January 8 and 10, 2018</u>: (Note the dates) Darlene Miller, an AZ Quilt Guild Traveling Teacher, will present two lectures. On Monday, January 8, the lecture will cover, "How to select the Best Quilting Design for your Quilt." This will be a unique and fun concept to explore. On Wednesday, January 10, the lecture will concentrate on "Fabric Preparation and Accurate Cutting." Your quilts will be a long- arm quilter delight when prepared with these few techniques.

<u>February 5 and 7, 2018:</u> Dusty and Stephanie Farrell of Country Stitchin' from Cambridge Springs, PA, will present a lecture on "New Tools, Rulers and Templates for Home Quilting" with trunk show and "The Fun of Quilting and Long Arming" with trunk show. March 5 and 7, 2018: Mathew and Heidi Pridemore of the Whimsical Workshop in Gilbert, AZ, will present two different programs. UPCOMING WORKSHOPS 2018

<u>January 9, 2018:</u> Darlene Miller will walk us in circles with her class on Radiant Suns. Your fabric selection will make each quilt unique while expanding your comfort zone with circles!! Now is your chance! Learn an easy no- pin technique to create beautiful smooth, curved seams and blocks. No experience necessary and easy for beginners as well. You will be surprised at what you can create. With your choice of color and fabrics you can have suns radiating or simply an array of beautiful colors. Class time will be 9 am-3 pm. Class and pattern cost: \$38; optional template available for \$27. If you did not pre-order your templates, then you may be able to order them on the date of the class to be shipped to us in late January.

<u>February 6, 2018:</u> Dusty and Stephanie Farrell will offer multiple potential classes 9 am-12 noon. Dusty is available to present a class on longarm techniques, while Stephanie can present a morning class on quilting with your home domestic machine. Number and type of classes will depend on interest. Cost \$25 per person. Quilters will be able to sample Dusty's rulers and template during all classes. Kay Warthan's Fabulous Chili Rellenos Casserole

- 1 Cup 1/2 and 1/2 Cream
- 2 Eggs
- 1/3 Cup Flour
- 1-27 oz Can Whole Green Chilis
- 8 oz Monterey Jack Cheese, grated
- 8 oz Sharp Cheddar Cheese, grated
- 1-8 oz Can Tomato Sauce

Beat cream, eggs, and flour until smooth. Split chilis, rinse seeds, and drain on paper towels. Mix cheeses. Spray pan or use butter. Then layer liquid mix, chilis, and cheese. Reserve 1/2 cup of cheese for top. Pour tomato sauce on top and sprinkle cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hr until cooked in center. Test with knife.

A doubled recipe for a party requires the same cooking time.

2018 HSQG Quilt Show Entry Rules and Definitions

RULES:

- Deadline for submission of entry forms is January 31, 2018. No late entries accepted. Completed entry forms must include photo and hang tag statement.
- 2. You must have a current HSQG membership to enter.
- 3. The entry must have been made by the guild member in whole or part.
- You may enter only one quilt per judged category. Judged quilt entries must not have been judged in any other HSQG show.
- 5. You may enter multiple quilts for Display (not judged).
- 6. The Show and Design Chairs reserve the right to limit the number of quilts per person if necessary.
- A color photo must be submitted with your entry form; 3 x 5 to 4 x 6 only, cut to this size. Write your
 name, quilt name, width and length on the back of the photo. The Design Committee will assign hanging
 space using your photo. A clear, true color photo is appreciated.
- 8. An entry will be rejected if it is not clean and free of smoke odors and pet hair.
- All quilts must have a 4 inch hanging sleeve sewn to the back of the quilt. Small quilts can use a 2 inch sleeve.
- Quilts must have a label with quilter's name and quilt name, sewn on. If the quilt is being judged, the
 quilter's name must be covered with muslin secured by basting or safety pins.
- Judged entries must be brought to Life in Christ Church, corner of Coronado and Las Brisas Way (across from the police station) on Wednesday, February 28th from 9:30 - 11:00 am. The Judging Committee will be responsible for getting judged quilts to Buena High School on Friday.
- 12. Display and Vintage entries must be brought to Buena High School on Friday, March 2 from 4-5 pm.
- All entries must be picked up on Sunday, March 4 from 3:30 4 pm with the receipt you are given at check-in.
- 14. The Show Chairs may combine categories with less than 5 entries for judging purposes and reserve the right to re-categorize any entry to comply with the definitions.
- 15. Entry forms must be turned in to Sue Lee at any meeting or mailed to her home. (see roster)
- 16. Please don't submit an entry unless you are sure it will be ready for the show!

CATEGORY DEFINITIONS:

Pieced: A quilt that is more than 50% pieced.

Appliqued: A quilt that is more than 50% appliqued.

Mixed Techniques: A quilt that contains more than one technique in equal amounts.

Group: A quilt whose top is made by two or more people.

Other: Techniques not listed such as yo-yo, cathedral window, whole cloth and tied.

Art: A quilt created as a work of art, reflecting innovative construction techniques, subject matter and/or materials.

Machine Embroidery: A quilt that is more than 50% machine embroidered, all sizes.

Apparel: Quilted clothing such as jackets and tops.

Hand Quilted: Quilts of all sizes and techniques that are completely hand quilted. You may also enter hand quilted items in other categories.

Awarded by the judge:

First, Second, Third and Honorable Mention ribbons as earned for each category.

Exemplary Hand Quilting, Exemplary Professional Machine Quilting, Exemplary Non-Professional Machine

Quilting, Best Use of Color, Best of Show, Judge's Choice, NACQJ Award of Merit

Viewer's Choice Ribbon: Awarded based on the quilt show attendees' votes

Arizona Quilters' Hall of Fame Award: Awarded by the Quilt Show Chair
