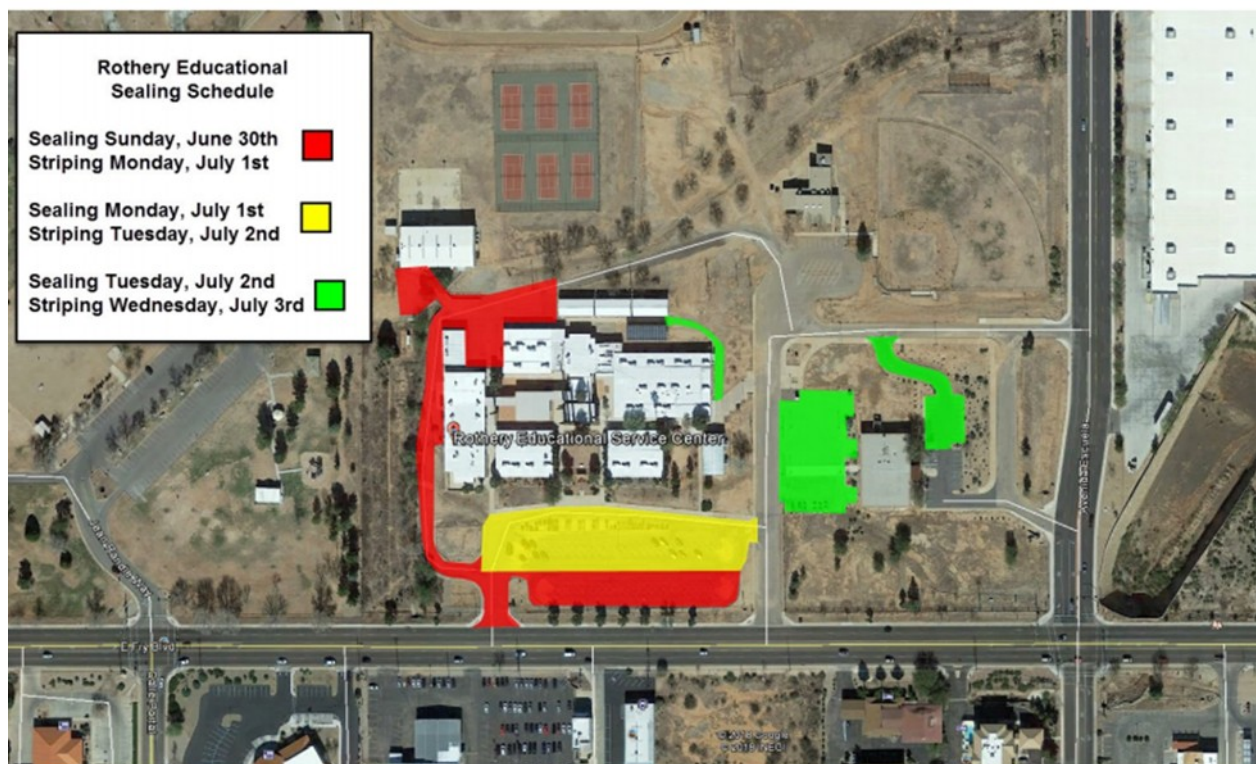
**Show Chair Intern.** You would work with Virginia and Melanie with the idea that in a year or two you would become the show chair.
