

Barn Quilt Painting Workshop

Saturday, 18 August 9am-1pm

Inspired by Suzi Parron, author of "Barn Quilts and the American Quilt Trail Movement"
(check out the blocks at the front of the guild)

Join the barn quilt movement by creating your own painted quilt block. You will begin with a pre-primed board and go through each step—drafting, taping, and painting, with careful attention to detail.

You will have two options:

- paint 12" by 12" blocks for the guild to be used to decorate quilt show signs
- OR paint your own 24" by 24" block.

We will spend about 3-4 hours together; once painting begins, you may work at your own pace.

Depending on your design, you should leave with a finished quilt block. The finished product will be two-by-two feet and is the perfect size for mounting on smaller buildings.

Supplies provided:

- ~ Pre-primed 2 by 2 foot board. The priming is a two-day job, which is already done for you!
- ~ Suggested patterns (you may bring your own, but keep it simple)
- ~ Paint
- ~ Foam brushes
- ~ Colored pencils and box cutters/other tools

You will need to bring:

- 1-inch painter's tape (just a partial roll, or several people can share one roll)
- Yardstick or 24-inch Ruler
- Pencil
