I hope to see many of our members on Thursday and Saturday, June 15th and 17th, for our Sew-Ins. We already have quilts finished for foster kids in Cochise County. Kits are available if you are not able to attend. The CASA Council of Cochise County will be delivering our quilts to children from newborn to 17 years of age in November and December. The Hummingbird Stitchers are making a difference in the lives of over 250 abused and neglected children in Cochise County.

I am reminded daily of the great works and service being performed by our HSQG members. From the community quilts we make, to the roles we assume to keep our guild running, I appreciate being part of this organization. We all know that there is never enough time to do all the things we'd like to accomplish! I'm living proof of the saying, "If you want something done, ask a busy person!"

To all our quilters who are working on cleaning out your stash (so you can replace it with a new stash of course!)

If you are finding fabrics as our Judy Neimeyer trainer suggested that are never going to see the front of a quilt, consider donating the larger pieces to the Guild. Our 310 quilts last year used at least 1200 yards of backings! With lessening income and more costs for batting, we are always in need of nice pieces. The quality of the quilts we donate, with our Guild label on them, deserve a somewhat coordinated backing, and we really don't want to sew more than 4 pieces. It makes it harder for our quilters and takes much longer to produce.

Many thanks to all of you who donate and sew for our community quilts; they are so appreciated.

We're Celebrating and Serving with the AQHF! Come to the CASA Sew-In Event

The Arizona Quilter's Hall of Fame (AQHF) is celebrating their 10th Anniversary with Sew-Ins to benefit Foster Children.

Did you know there are over 19,000 children in foster care in AZ, with over 250 in Cochise County?

Did you know that a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) may be a foster child's only constant adult supporter as they go through the dependency court process?

We'll be partnering with the CASA Council of Cochise County to distribute quilts to foster children aged newborn to 17 yrs in November and December.

Our Sew-Ins will be on Thursday, June 15th and Saturday, June 17th. On Thursday the hours will be 9 am to 8 pm. On Saturday the hours will be 9 am to 3 pm. Quilts will be from layette to twin sized.


Bottled water will be available, but please bring your snacks, lunch, and coffee or soft drinks. Long sewing day—have to keep up your energy!

Quilters can check these out at any time, especially if you will not be able to attend the Sew-Ins. We have batting and backing available, and our Stash Ladies are always happy to receive donations of fabric and batting for all our community outreach projects.

HSQG 17 Quilt Challenge

You will pick a ticket at random, keep one side of the ticket..it will tell you the name of the quilt you will be making. Sign and turn in the other side of the ticket and you will be registered to participate.

Rules to follow to be eligible for an OSCAR (prizes). (otherwise it will be hung as "Display Only")

Must be a current member of HSQG to draw a ticket.

* The name of the movie that you have drawn at random has to be the name of the quilt that you make.

(Don't worry..... others will not be happy either, it's a challenge, remember !!)

* Challenge quilt can be any finished size you want...BUT...it can be no wider than 25' and no longer that 25'. It does not have to be square, it can be a rectangle. (size matters because our display area is limited)

* Use whatever construction or quilting methods work best for you....challenge yourself, be creative !!

There is no fabric requirement to be met, no limit to the total number or type of fabrics used. Embellishments are optional.

* Put a label on the back of your entry (name of quilt and your name, at least). Hopefully, you will be entering your quilt in the challenge category of the 2018 show, so go ahead and put that sleeve on it now!!

* Entry tickets must be in by the end of September.

*Finished challenge quilts MUST be at the November evening and daytime meetings for judging by the Academy !! (Guild members).
