I hope everyone has a chance to enjoy the crisp mornings changing scenery!




For Sale

Upcoming 2017 Workshops

October 3, 2017: Kay Wentworth will share her techniques for turning fabric into art by helping us create Portraits of Our Pets. This workshop demonstrates raw-edge applique techniques that do not use glue or adhesive materials such as wonder under. Pick out your picture (does not have to be a pet). Class will cost \$30 per person, minimum of 10 students. The workshop will be all day (TBA: 9 am-3pm or 10 am-4 pm). Check out her website at: https://kaywentworth.carbonmade.com/

October 7, 2017: Cynthia Hatch will offer the second in a series of three classes on how to make and decorate your very own temari ball, Class will be 9 am-noon. Class two will cost \$15, and you will bring all your own materials to include your mari ball. The third class is Saturday, November 4, 2017 (see below).

October 10 and 14, 2017: Swan Sheridan of Swan Amity Studios will host a Tuffet workshop for \$125 including pattern. There is only one spot left, and then all her patterns will be sold out. On day one from 10 am-2 pm, you will receive sewing instructions. On day two, we will assemble the tuffet. The cost includes the pattern and all stool materials. You will provide your own fabric. All tuffets have a finished size of 18" wide x 8" of foam with 4-1/2" feet for a total of 13" tall when the base is included. The tuffet stools are perfect to be use as foot stools, small seats, and are great for children. For other ideas check out: http://tuffetsource.com/shop/#.

November 4, 2017: Cynthia Hatch will offer the third and final class on how to make and decorate your very own Temari ball. During this class, you will learn two more stitches so you can make a more complex and beautiful Temari ball. After this class, you will be more comfortable tackling simple and complex 8, 10, or 12 designs. Class will be from 9 to noon. Class 2 will cost \$15, and you will bring all your own materials to include your Temari ball.
