Another one of the fun activities we conduct is a two-month program at the Sierra Vista Boys and Girls Club. This year we will be helping the children each make a small quilt. This project is chaired by Shirley Fogle.

During the years other activities have included; making and presenting the Sierra Vista 50th Anniversary Commemorative Quilt to the City of Sierra Vista, pillow cases for soldiers overseas and for children in hospitals and conducting beginning quilting classes.

In addition, for more than 30 years, the annual Hummingbird Stitchers Quilt Show has displayed an incredible collection of quilts and wall hangings. From the first quilt show where only 30 quilts were displayed in the early 80s, the show has grown over the years and is visited by people from all over the country. The show is held the last weekend in February at the Buena High School.

This year there were more than 175 quilts displayed in addition to vendor and member booths, a guild boutique, and a display of vintage quilts & tablecloths. The quilt appraisal services of Joyce Larson, a certified quilt appraiser, were also available. Our show chairwomen; Lynne Bie, Sue Lee, Nancy Banz and boutique chairwoman, MaryAnn Lepic, and all the members worked hard all year to prepare for this show.

This year's theme, "A Celebration of Patchwork," was highlighted by a raffle quilt – Golden Glow. The making of
