



QUILT SHOW SET-UP

Good day, Ladies.

I would like to remind you all that we are not allowed into the Buena High School cafeteria until 4pm the afternoon of Friday, March 1, 2024 for the quilt show set-up. Please park your cars in the adjacent parking lot to alleviate blocking quilt show delivery vehicles. And, if you do park in the ramp area, move your car as soon as it is unloaded. The broad stroke plan is to unload all the boutique merchandise and display fixtures first.

Then, we will break into row set up teams, and work with them to erect the poles and drapes. After dinner, the teams will divide into two dirty ladder climbers, two semi clean display pole inserters, and a clean quilt handler. This will keep the quilts clean by not having people touch poles and then quilts.

The teams will use S-hooks, and suspension cables to hang and adjust each quilt as they are hung. The idea is not to have to come back and adjust the height of the quilts once they are hung. The ladder people can stay on the ladders, the semi- clean people can fit the quilts onto the rods, and hand them up to the ladder folks, and the clean person can advise how to best adjust for height and level. This way, once you have worked down a row, it is completed.

Please sign up in advance so we know who, and how many to expect to help. If you would, please put a ¹/₂ inch wrench in your pocket, and bring a light-weight ladder; everything else will be furnished. All the quilt show sign-up books are on the table under the bulletin board.

New guidelines for making backs for quilt tops: please make the backing at least 5" longer on each of the top & bottom edges and 4" on each side. This allows for ease in loading the backing without the quilter having to add an extra leader.

Also, please sew down any seam edges from piecing so the seam doesn't come apart in loading.

Every little bit helps our long-arms who volunteer time & thread!

SQS (Sharing Quilting Skills)

Starting in January, the guild will start the Sharing Quilting Skills (SQS) that was a result of our survey. These minisessions will be on select Thursday afternoons, 1230-2. The informal sessions will be on a drop-in basis. Bring a project you need help with, learn a new skill, or refine a rusty one. If you would be willing to share your skill, let Debi G know or sign up.

On Jan 11th, Mary Lou will be available to show how to make the Christmas star ornaments. She will have fabric ready to use. On the 25th, Jill H will be ready to help with wool appliqué/embroidery. There will be small wool kits available for purchase at the Guild. Also on the 11th & 25th, Maryann will be there to show how to make a string block on a foundation and Debi G will help with quilt sleeves, labels, and general quilting questions. In Feb, Shirley A will work with those interested in learning to make dog/cat beds. She requests you bring scraps of any fabrics you have: any non-cotton quilting fabrics like corduroy, knits, curtain fabrics, bed pads, fleece, etc. and batting leftovers that are larger than 1 inch wide. And bring your sewing machine, so you can make a bed that day.



PASSWORD CHANGE: Members Only Tab

2024 HSQG Quilt Show Entry Rules and Definitions

RULES:

Deadline for submission of entry forms is January 18, 2024. No late entries accepted. Completed entry forms must include photo and hang tag statement and be <u>received</u> by January 18th. Be cautious of the deadline if mailing.

You must have a current HSQG membership to enter.

The entry must have been made by the guild member in whole or part.

You may enter only one quilt *per judged category*. Judged quilt entries must not have been judged in any other HSQG show.

You may enter multiple quilts for Display (not judged.) Entries will be accepted on a space-available basis.

The Show and Design Chairs reserve the right to limit the number of quilts per person if necessary.

A color photo must be submitted with your entry form; 3 x 5 to 4 x 6 only, cut to this size. Write your name, quilt name,

width and length on the back of the photo. The Design Committee will assign hanging space using your photo. An entry will be rejected if it is not clean and free of smoke odors and pet hair.

All quilts must have a 4-inch hanging sleeve <u>sewn</u> to the back of the quilt. Small quilts can use a 2 inch sleeve.

Quilts must have a label with quilter's name and quilt name, sewn on. If the quilt is being judged, the quilter's name must be covered with fabric secured by basting.

<u>All entries</u> must be brought to the **Ethel Berger Center**, **2950 E. Tacoma**, on Wednesday, February 28th, from 9:00 - 11:00 am. The Committee will be responsible for getting all quilts to Buena High School on Friday.

All entries must be picked up on Sunday, March 3^{rd} , from 3.45 - 4.30 pm with the receipt you are given at check-in. The show chairs may re-categorize any entry to comply with the definitions.

All quilts purchased at the show will pay the Guild a 10% handling fee as per the bylaws.

Entry forms must be turned in to Georgia Mastin at any meeting or mailed to her home. (see roster)

Please don't submit an entry unless you are sure it will be ready for the show!

CATEGORY DEFINITIONS:

Appliqued: A quilt that is more than 50% appliqued.

Pieced: A quilt that is more than 50% pieced.

Mixed Techniques: A quilt that contains more than one technique in **equal amounts**.

Hand Quilted: Quilts of all sizes and techniques that are hand quilted. (You may also enter hand quilted items in other categories.)

Non-traditional: A quilt created as a work of art, reflecting innovative construction techniques, subject matter and/or materials and using no commercial patterns.

Machine Embroidery: A quilt that is more than 50% machine embroidered, all sizes.

Modern: Any techniques may be used but quilts in this category must feature at least one of the following criteria: 1) a significant amount of negative space, 2) dense graphic quilting, 3) the majority of fabrics used should read as solid. **Group:** A quilt made by three or more people.

Other: Techniques not listed such as yo-yo, cathedral window, whole cloth and apparel.

CATEGORY SIZES: Small – perimeter less than 168". Medium – perimeter 168"-279". Large – perimeter 280" or greater
