(There are numerous variations of this block.)

My favorite part of quilting is figuring out what to make and then piecing it. Dying fabric is my other hobby. I enjoy ice dying and am also working on making my own batiks."



Thanks to all who have volunteered to take a quilt kit home to piece the backing. We rarely include more than 2 pieces of fabric for the back. A couple of things to remember: the back should be at least 4" bigger than the top all around.

Please trim off the selvage before stitching the seam & press it open to reduce bulk. Stitch down the ends of the seam to prevent it coming open during setup.

Return any unused fabric with the kit as we may use it for the binding or for the jelly roll project. Be sure to re-pin the routing tag on the front as we use it for inventory. Thank you so much.

...And Regarding the Barn Quilt Effort

Challenge Quilt Guidelines:

- 1. Quilts can measure 12 inches wide by 18 inches long, 18 inches wide by 12 inches long or 15 inches square, ($\underline{\text{or smaller}}$, but no larger than 60" perimeter). The quilt can have an irregular shape (i.e.: wavy or jagged edges). Measure the edge as best you can.
- 2. There are no subject requirements and you may use the quilting techniques of your choice (applique, piecing, embellishing, etc.)
- 3. All quilts must consist of a quilt top, batting, backing, "finished edge" label and sleeve.
- 4. Quilts must be black, white + one pop of color.
- 5. Fabrics do not have to be <u>solid</u> colors. Prints that are black with white design or white with black design are allowed. Only one pop of color allowed, although it can appear more than once in the guilt.
- 6. Please sign up for the Challenge by emailing JoAnn at vandine@Q.com by July 1.
- 7. **IMPORTANT:** For all entries, please email JoAnn at <u>vandine@Q.com</u> by <u>October 15</u> with your name, name of the quilt and size of the quilt.
- 8. The challenge quilt viewing and voting takes place at the November guild meetings. More details will be released in October.

Wed, 21 Jun 2023- "Pincushion Party". Let's party with Helen Frost! Come have fun creating a new batch of cute and clever pincushions. You'll make a "red delicious" apple, a wool strawberry and perky mouse, and a Nine Patch chicken. All the machine sewing has been done for you so all you need to do is hand stitch, stuff, and embellish. The class will be free with a \$10.00 kit to purchase.

Wed, 19 Jul 2023 – Karen Reifer will be giving a workshop on Gem Trees using copper wire.

Wed, 20 Sep 2023 – Our own Guild member, Kathi Shunn, will be teaching us a specialized English Paper Piecing technique. Samples of what she will teach us to make, and a sign-up sheet are posted at the guild.



Wed, 18 Oct 2023 – Michele Markly, will be teaching us the techniques for creating an individually colored pattern of a hummingbird. The kit will cost \$65.00 (includes \$45.00 for the class and \$20.00 for the kit) and includes the hummingbird pattern below printed on fabric, and use of all her inktense pencils, fabric markers, and jell pens. Class participants will not have to provide their own.
